#### G. Consultation Undertaken

#### H. Fees

This section only applies to applications with a commercial focus – which will include applications from registered companies. The Department does not charge fees for domestic Marine Mammals Protection Act research permits.

The exception to this is any costs of Public Notification in the Gazette, if the application is for exporting or importing marine mammal parts. This cost is non-waivable for all applicants.

Section 60B of the Conservation Act enables the Department to recover all direct and indirect costs from an Applicant to process an application regardless of whether the application is approved or declined. If at any stage an application is withdrawn the Department will invoice the Applicant for the costs incurred by the Department up to that point. Applicants are required to pay the processing fees within 28 days of receiving an invoice. The Director-General is entitled to recover any unpaid fees as a debt.

The estimated standard application fee is \$2065 + GST. This covers most applications.

However if your application is likely to have significant effects, is novel, or spans multiple DOC regions, it will require more careful consideration and may take longer to process and incur higher processing fees.

You will be sent an estimate of costs in this situation. We will contact you to advise if the fee is more than the estimated standard cost. Applicants are also entitled to request an estimate of costs at any point, but the Department may impose a charge for preparing such an estimate. Estimates are not binding.

You may also be required to pay a fee to cover the cost of the Department monitoring the effects of your activity. Please contact the Permissions team (<a href="mailto:christchurchpermissions@doc.govt.nz">christchurchpermissions@doc.govt.nz</a>) to discuss whether these fees apply.
